Snippets from General Meeting 14th June 09

It was agreed that the annual Scale Rally be conducted on the weekend of the 26th September, Monday being the Queen's Birthday holiday.

Further discussion will be held closer to the date to arrange catering and any other details necessary.

Concerns were raised about some safety issues that had occurred at the field and discussion relating to these were held, as a result the following was to be implemented immediately to prevent a reoccurrence:

A) When a new model is having it's maiden flight or the first flight after a major repair to a plane the flight line must be clear and other pilots are not permitted to fly until the test plane has completed it's flight.

- B) There is to be only one flight line at any time dur ing a flying session, all pilots must stand on that flight line for the duration of their flight. When wind direction changes the flight line must be moved as soon as practical to comply with this standard
- C) Confirmation has been received from AWA re who is legally eligible to train new pilots at the field, it stated that this is an individual club deci sion, however it strongly recommended that the person conducting the training be at least Gold Wing proficiency.

Issues relating to site rubbish were raised and it was agreed that due the amount of rubbish that accumulates over a period of time by placing it into the large bins and then it becomes a problem for it's disposal, that the large bins be removed and that the rubbish that accumulates on a daily basis should be removed by the individual members.

The large bins will be used for special functions were it is anticipated that a larger quantity of rubbish will be generated for disposal.

It was agreed that a sign be erected at the field highlighting the golden rules that are applicable to the club, this should not include all the By-Laws of the club but the rules flyers should be aware of prior to flying at the field.

Grahame & Scott retained their positions both re-elected unopposed. Kevin handed the reigns of treasurer over to Anthony Amadio.

The World of Electrics!

Dennis Green has converted all his planes to electric and is now having a ball with his flying, he was convinced by wife Brenda to go this way as he has struggled for around 14 months with hip problems. This prevented him from comfortably getting down on the start line and starting his fuel system planes which lead to him not being able to enjoy his flying, he was lucky to get one flight in during the morning due to the discomfort and fatigue he would experience, he now gets around six flights a session.

He has since had two hip operations which initially also restricted him bending or walking any distance, and at times he has been seen walking long distances around the field, mainly to retrieve dead stick landing that have come down short of the runway. (I think Brenda got a bit sick of being the Pit Crew and retrieving models as well)

All the preparation for electric flight is done in the upright position which really suits his condition, nil bending. He now has a variety of different models with different powered motors and batteries as a result of experimentation with these models. This has been the resurrection of Dennis's flying, when he alights from his van at Sunday morning flying sessions there is now a procession from the van to the flight line with a variety of models ready for the mornings flying.

It is a pleasure standing on the flight with Dennis when he is flying as you have no difficult hearing if the motor on your own plane has gone dead stick.

Interesting article on Spectrum system compliments of Paul Dodge:

The latest edition of RCM news made a comment about Spectrum systems dropping out sometimes. I have also found this when I first started using a Spectrum 7 set which I've had for 2 years now.

My plane went into 'latch up' (ie no response mode for several seconds) just before the final turn which dire consequences. After correspondence with JR and forums I found a few interesting things out – hopefully they are all true!

Firstly the short 1" antennae had been coiled up inside a bit of foam rubber which is a no-no – they need to be pointing straight out. However the antennae on the other smaller Rx were OK so I don't think this caused the problem. Secondly I think an out of range condition resumes immediate control when range is re-established and at that stage I was holding my Tx above my head etc and the plane was only about 200m away. So I don't think that was the problem but worth noting.

The other more important thing I found out was that the Rx has to have a voltage above 3.7V (or thereabouts) to operate properly and even a small glitch will cause a power outage. This was verified by one of the club members who has a variable voltage power supply. Once the Rx sees a power outage it then appears to go through a start up program to re-establish the link and this can take several seconds which is a long time when you're about to crash!

This low voltage could happen with say a partly discharged 5V battery and using digital servos which is what I had (as per the standard items supplied with the system). Part of the answer was to install a high capacity electrolytic capacitor in one of the spare servo inputs. I used a 2200uF/16V with very short leads (10mm). Spectrum recommend a special type with low inductance but I used one

from Dick Smiths for around a dollar. If you choose a short fat one then it should have a low inductance by design. The other part of the solution is to use 6V batteries instead of 5V batteries - I think this is the most important change to make. Anyway I haven't had any problems since I made these changes.

The concerns that Paul had, above, were included in an Email to Brian Green, his response is in next column.

JR have dropped the low voltage cut out level of the 2.4 stuff to improve the reliability with low performing batteries.

I would also suggest you use a digi switch instead of the slide switch. It drops less voltage under load.

Desert Aircraft have them.

I am just about to go flying with me new JR Spectrum system. The manual with my JR 2.4 does clearly state the requirement for adequate power supply and what happens if it is not good enough.

From memory 4 Milli seconds to regain control after signal loss.


Several second to reboot after low voltage.

June Edition Medical /First Aid Tips ABOUT HEART ATTACKS!!



Heart attacks account for many deaths in Australia each year, the importantance placed on Urgent Medical attention when a person experiences the symptoms of an attack will greatly improve the outcome of such an event.

75% of all heart attacks occur in the home!!

The signs and symptoms that usually occur during a heart attack can be, severe, moderate to mild pain located in the chest, it can radiate down into the left arm, also radiate up into the Jaw.

As well as nausea, sweating and pale cold clammy skin, which is an indication of shock, there may be a shortness of breath.

<u>NOTE</u>: There may also be no pain in the chest during an heart attack.

The majority of people (about 60%) who had an heart attack during their sleep, did not wake during the attack up because of the pain. However, if a severe attack occurs, the chest pain may wake you up from your deep sleep.

If you experience these symptoms immediately call an ambulance, state that you have severe, moderate to mild chest pain and difficulty in breathing, sit down and relax and dissolve an Aspirin, if you have no allergies to them, under the tongue (or taken with small amount of water) It is important to always have ASPIRIN in the home of persons who are at risk of having a heart attack.

Aspirin coats the red blood vessels and minimizes clotting, it is also designed to lower blood pressure

Remain seated in an upright position of comfort, it is not advisable to lay down as the pain is likely to intensify. Restrict any movement, remain calm and wait the arrival of the Ambulance. Do not attempt to walk outside to meet the Ambulance as this will greatly increase the workload of the heart.

One wallet and one pair of shoes -- one colour for all seasons.


